Could your child/children be eligible for benefit-related Free School Meals? Please help!

All children in Reception, Year 1, and Year 2 automatically receive a free school meal every day under the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme. However, did you know that if you apply for **benefit-related Free School Meals** and are eligible, your child and their school gain even more benefits?

When children are identified as benefit-related FSM, the school receives additional funding to ensure they get as many opportunities as possible. Currently, we receive an **additional £1,480 per Pupil** Premium child (those who have received benefit-related FSM at any point in the last 6 years). This funding enables us to subsidise the price of school trips, have more teaching assistants and inclusion officers, and include additional opportunities within their learning.






