Starting School in September 2025 - Key Information for Parents

If your child was born between September 1st, 2020, and August 31st, 2021, they can start school in September 2025.

In **Portsmouth**, applications for starting school in September 2025 opened on November 4th, 2024, and close on January 15th, 2025.

What You Need to Know:

- Applications for primary school places opened in November and close on January 15th 2025.
- You can still apply even if you plan for your child to start later in the school year.
- If you need to update your application, email the Admissions Team with:
 - \Diamond Your child's name
 - Their date of birth
 - Details of the changes you'd like to make

Join us on **Tuesday, 16th January**, to celebrate **Winnie the Pooh Day** with a special themed lunch inspired by everyone's favourite bear.




Exciting News! Our First Gardening Competition of the Year

NHS Pharmacy First Service

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment? Accessing the service may mean that can help children feel better and back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over


